Safety

Lifejackets must be worn for all those novice and junior paddlers competing in Hikoikoi 7's Challenge regardless of experience (this includes the steerers)

<u>Please ensure you are familiar with the New Zealand Waka Ama race rules and safety rules, available at www.wakaama.co.nz.</u>

Paddlers must be aware of rules and be able to self rescue (understand what needs to happen should your waka capsise), ALL WAKA MUST CARRY SAFETY EQUIPMENT AS FOLLOWS:

- Bungs
- Lifejackets
- Bailers
- Spare paddles
- Spray skirts
- Tow rope
- All paddlers must be appropriately dressed for the conditions (thermal wear, beanies recommended)

DISCLAIMER

On the Saturday in case of severe weather conditions, a natural disaster, or events beyond the control of the organisers, the event will be held on Sunday 30 June.

Race organisers reserve the right to amend the distance or course or cancel the race or refuse entry for any reason related to the safety of the event and paddlers.

Costs

Payment of \$7 per paddler/team registration must be paid prior to competition. If you are competing in more than one event you will still be required to pay \$7 per registration please to assist with safety and support crew costs.

MATARIKI STARS

Matariki can be translated in two ways – Mata Riki (Tiny Eyes) and Mata Ariki (Eyes of God). Some say Matariki is a mother surrounded by her six daughters while others suggest Matariki is a male star.

However, the Matariki cluster can be seen from all parts of the world, and is most commonly known as Pleiades. Other names it is known by include Subaru, the Seven Sisters and Messier 45.

Iwi have their own names for the seven Matariki stars, and the most common are:
